Code of Ethics

- 1. Maintain the highest standards of professional conduct consistent with membership of the corporation.
- 2. Observe the highest degree of integrity and responsibility in regard to the practice of acupuncture.
- 3. Consultation, assessment, or treatment of a child under the age of 18 must be done in the presence or with the consent of a parent or legal guardian or other responsible adult approved by the parent or guardian.
- 4. Recognize that the interest and welfare of the patient are paramount.
- 5. Respect, without compromise, the confidentiality between practitioner and patient.
- 6. Treatment fees must be reasonable and clearly stated prior to treatment.
- 7. Patient must provide informed consent prior to commencement of treatment.
- 8. The practitioner must maintain the correct decorum expected of a professional healthcare provider.
- 9. Refrain from making statements or claims that misrepresent the therapeutic benefits of their treatment or that bring a professional colleague or organization into disrepute.
- 10. It is a member's responsibility to bring forward, with proof, any knowledge of misconduct, breach of trust, or other violations of the code of ethics, bylaws and/or policies of the corporation in writing to the attention of the Board of the corporation.
- 11. All members must pay their Annual Membership fee and dues.
- 12. Practicing members must maintain their professional liability insurance for acupuncture.
